

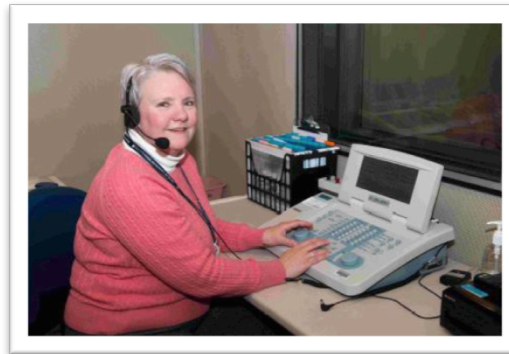

Charlotte Mullen, AuD, is the primary pediatric audiologist for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program and Coordinator for Education and Training for the audiology service of Boston Children's Hospital. She founded the Sound Outreach to Schools educational audiology program. Mullen has given numerous presentations to professional and parent groups. Her clinical work initially identified an increased incidence in hearing loss among children treated by extra-corporeal membrane oxygenation (ECMO). Working closely with the Developmental Medicine Program, Mullen developed a clinical practice guideline for audiological monitoring which led to incorporation into the 2007 Joint Committee on Infant Hearing recommendations.

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
