
## Learning

In the process, we discovered ways to enhance communication, personal accountability, and restructure classroom instruction to improve outcomes for all students.

Visual-tactile approaches that feature face-to-face interaction and production of ASL-English bilingual texts has flourished in an electronics-rich environment, due to the ability to capture sign language on video and create media-rich digital texts with both languages existing alongside one another.

The inclusion of multiple languages as well as accessibility features (a big focus of Apple's), allows for the creation of materials that students and their families can both access readily, enabling connection, and future success for students, teachers, staff and families at the Clerc Center.
