Activities

- Have your child draw a fire station on a piece of paper and cut out pictures of firefighters and fire engines to paste on the paper next to it. Encourage your child to write a sentence about the picture.
- Fingerspell the different things associated with firefighters (e.g., fire truck, fire engine, hose) and have your child sign them back to you or vice-versa.
- Cut out pictures of firefighters from magazines or newspapers. Glue them on a piece of paper and ask your child to list beside each picture the different activities that firefighters do.
