Activities

- Put a calendar in a central place and encourage all family members to use it to record where they plan to go.
- Cookie gets into a lot of mischief by going where she is not supposed to go. Make a game-board showing "Okay" and "Stay Away" places. With your child, draw or cut pictures from magazines to represent places your child is allowed to go and places to stay away from. Arrange the pictures/drawings as spaces in a path. Roll one die or use a spinner from another game to indicate how many spaces to move. Landing on an "Okay" place entitles the player to an additional throw of the die or a spin.
- Observe cats and dogs when you and your child go for a walk. How are they alike and how are they different?
