Activities

 Staple the pages together to make a book. Put a title on the book cover and read the book
 made with your child.
- Play a number game. Get ten small toys or objects (e.g., small blocks, toy cars). Sign a number from one to ten and have your child get the corresponding number of objects. Reverse roles.
