Activities

- Hide chocolate eggs in a room and ask your child to look for them. When your child is done, ask him or her what colors the eggs are and how many he or she found.
- With your child, cut out egg shapes from magazine pages. Paste them on cereal cardboard boxes and cut them out. Then make a hole at the top of each egg shape and string them together. Cut out letters from the magazine to make up the phrase "Happy Easter" and paste one letter on each egg shape. Hang the decoration together.
- Help your child make a sequence of four cards that show the different stages of hatching eggs
 (an egg in the nest, a cracking egg, a chick partly out of an egg, and a chick fully hatched). Let
 your child label the process for each card.
