## **Activities**

- Draw five pumpkin faces on a sheet of bond paper and have your child number each in order.
   Point to each pumpkin consecutively and recite with your child what each one said in the story.
- Play a "trick or treat" game with your child. Cut out small pumpkins and color them. On the back of each pumpkin write a treat (e.g., one cookie) or a trick (e.g., hop on one foot) and put the pumpkins in a small brown bag or box. Take turns drawing them from the bag.
- Cut out five pumpkins and paste them on a sheet of bond paper. Next, draw dialogue balloons for each pumpkin. Have your child make up dialogues for each pumpkin.
