Activities

- Make a Passover Seder plate with your child. Cut out shapes or pictures of the items placed on a Seder plate (a bone; charoset--chopped nuts, apples, honey, and cinnamon; horseradish; an egg; and parsley). Paste the shapes or pictures onto a paper plate and label each item.
- Review the words from the "Words You Know" page, the next to last page in the book. Sign each word with your child or have her or him fingerspell the labels of each picture.
- Have your child make a Passover poster. She or he can cut out a picture from a magazine or draw a picture that will symbolize Passover, then paste it on a piece of construction paper. Help your child label the poster "Passover" and then put the dates of Passover or write "Happy Passover!" at the top of the poster.
