### Activities

- Find a fountain where people have thrown coins and made wishes. Give your child a penny to throw in while making a wish. Keep a list of the wishes to refer to for special occasions, such as birthdays and holidays.
- Luis's grandfather makes Luis's wish come true. Identify some family wishes and plan ways with your child to make one of the wishes come true.
- Make a special hat with your child using a paper bag that is slightly larger than your child's head. Decide what kind of special hat this will be, for example, a crown, a firefighter's hat, a cowboy hat, or whatever your child prefers. Fold the top of the bag several times to make a band to help the hat fit properly. Use markers, glue, colored papers, or scraps of cloth to decorate the hat.
