Now that you and your child have read the story, enjoy one or more of the following activities. Remember, it's also OK to read the story again and again!

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Activities

- If your child has a pet, ask her or him to draw or find pictures of it from before and now. Help your child write a short description for each picture. If your child doesn't have a pet, ask what she or he might want and then have her or him draw it and write a short description of it.
- Have your child make an album of pet animals. Cut out pictures of animals from magazines or newspapers, paste them on pieces of paper, and have your child label the names of the different pet animals. Staple the finished pages together to make the album.
- Help your child make an acrostic from a pet's name or from the name of any animal that your child can think of. Have her or him write one-word descriptions starting with each letter of the pet's or animal's name (e.g., T-I-N-Y ... T-errific, I-ntelligent, N-ice, Y-oung).
