Activities

- Tell a new version of the story by using family members instead of farm animals.
- Create a guessing game out of a folder by drawing several rectangle "windows" of various sizes on it. Cut out the windows on three sides, leaving the fourth attached so that each rectangle can be lifted to reveal what is underneath. Collect a variety of pictures and put them in the folder one at a time. See how many rectangles have to be lifted before the players can guess what the picture is.
- Make a puzzle from wrapping paper with specific designs. Glue the paper to light cardboard and cut it into puzzle pieces.
